The following procedures have been established for the continuity of the facility. When planning a day/ camping outing it is necessary to contact the member listed below for the gate combination. For security reasons the combination will be changed throughout the season. The camp is available to <u>our</u> Unit members for day use and/or camping with your stock. The camp is set up with three large stock pens and three camp sites offered on a 1st come 1st served basis. The three picnic tables and fire pit are located in a shared area. It is necessary for you to furnish water for personal use and stock use. The pens <u>must</u> be cleaned of hay/manure after each use or a fee will be assessed for clean up; remember our "Leave No Trace" policy. There is no potable water on site; however a port-a-potty is on site for our human needs.



7-up Cobbler

Frozen berries, dry cake mix, and 1 can of sprite, yummy cobbler. It sounds so easy - and it is good and weight watcher friendly! Ingredients Two 12-oz bags frozen mixed berries 1 box white cake mix (no pudding), 1 can of diet 7-up or sierra mist (clear soda)

Instructions: Place frozen fruit in a 9x13 baking dish. Add dry cake mix over the top. Pour soda slowly over cake mix. DO NOT stir the cake mix and the pop - this will give you a 'crust'. If you stir the two, you will have a cake-like topping. Bake 350 for 45-50 min.



Muriel Holland honored our unit with the Top Hand Award this year. She loves to go to the backcountry with our work parties and help.



Can you help the fool find his mother?



This is the season that many foals are being born. So see if you can help this little guy find his mother.


