For security reasons the combination will be changed throughout the season. The camp is available to <u>our</u> Unit members for day use and/or camping with your stock. The camp is set up with three large stock pens and three camp sites offered on a 1st come 1st served basis. The three picnic tables and fire pit are located in a shared area. It is necessary for you to furnish water for personal use and stock use. The pens <u>must</u> be cleaned of hay/manure after each use or a fee will be assessed for clean up; remember our "Leave No Trace" policy. There is no potable water on site; however a port-a-potty is on site for our human needs.



Edison Work Party 2015

I love our work parties. We get exercise, ride to our heart's content, help clear the trails, build improvements, develop friendships, and EAT. It's a great way to spend a week away from the valley heat, and this year's Edison work party was no exception.

We began in our usual fashion caravanning up the Kaiser Pass. Our party consisted of **Joe and Carol Kaminski**, **Pete Parkin**, **Duane Peverill**, **Gene Simone**, **Muriel Holland**, **Ruth Cramer**, **Fredi Chrisman**, **Cara Peterson**, **Jim Dixon**, **and Dylan**, **Jim Dixon's grandson**. Fredi's granddaughter pitched in as our lead car driver. She did a great job alerting oncoming cars that a line of horse trailers were coming down the bumpy one lane road. Upon arrival, we settled in at **John and Jenise Cunningham's** pack station.



Since our party was smaller than in past years, John and Jenise invited us ladies to sleep in the tent cabin so we wouldn't have to trouble ourselves with tents. Our whole party was also encouraged to use the pack station's shower when needed. Their hospitality was very appreciated after a day of working the dusty trails. We felt like we were staying in a hotel instead of camping.

Joe and Carol Kaminski really outdid themselves this year. Not only did they (along with Fredi's help) do their usual stellar job of cooking for all of us, but Joe also did all of the chainsaw work on the trails that were near the pack station. We started working on Saturday and cleared different parts of the trail through Tuesday. Joe cleared many fallen and leaning dead trees that were posing hazards on the trails. Special attention and discussion went into trees that were pinning 'spring trees' since other units have suffered injuries while cutting similar hazards. The rest of us pitched in with smaller handsaws to clear smaller hazard trees and branches. We also used handheld pruners to trim back low branches along trails as we rode.

On Tuesday, Duane and I split off with **Vic from the forestry service** to do a trash pickup at the Mono Creek inlet at the backside of the lake. The trail was very challenging in places with granite steps and slopes, but all of the horses and mules did well and kept their footing. We picked up some old lumber and a bit of rebar, packed it onto Vic's mules, and brought it back to the trail-head.

On Wednesday, we went to the nearby Forestry Service stockyard and helped Vic remove a few dead trees and reinforce his fences. Then we went to the Vermillion resort and enjoyed some well deserved ice cream.

Thursday was our day for free time. Muriel and I rode up past Graveyard Meadows and fished in Cold Creek. I lost count of how many brook trout I caught. I brought three back for a before dinner snack for myself and Muriel. Pete, Duane, Jim, Dillon, Carol, and Ruth rode up toward Devil's Bathtub and took the cutoff trail toward Graveyard Meadow. They also rode up the Onion Springs road to an area with beautiful panoramic views.

We finished by caravanning out on Friday morning with many thanks and goodbyes to our coworkers and hosts. It was a smooth drive out with Ruth driving the lead car. We emerged at the Rancheria area at Huntington Lake perhaps a bit tired, but surely a few pounds heavier thanks to Joe and Carol. Until next year!







Chamberlain Work Party

Being my first work party and packing in to a remote location I was very excited but also a little apprehensive of what the next five days would encounter. So my husband and I headed off to the trailhead on Thursday morning knowing that the rest of the party would not arrive until later that evening. We stopped in Prather for lunch and then proceeded on up towards Courtright Resevoir. After turning on the road out of Dinkey to Courtright the weather began to change. Yes it was raining. Rain never hurt anyone. We made it to the Courtright Reservoir turn off and it stopped raining and we proceeded on up the hill. We got to the top of the climb and were heading toward the dam when we came upon a long stretch of snow about a foot deep. I was beginning to wonder if I should have my husband turn around but he said he would proceeded to the dam where he could safely turn around.

Low and behold after 2 miles the snow completely disappeared and it was smooth cruising to **Maxson Trailhead**. We took a short ride while waiting for others to arrive but had to return to the trailer and hide inside to get out of the down pour. Two hikers on the trail were trying to out run the storm and they actually walked faster than our mules. So far, the work party experience was not gaining a lot of points in my book.

Finally everyone showed up and we had to wait for daylight to get the pack animals ready and head off to **Chamberlain Camp.** Since our main project was to get four **Bear Boxes** into Chamberlain **Bob Schwoerer** with his jeep and trailer offered to deliver the boxes to Voyager Campground where **Bob Herrick** and his pack team would pick them up the following day to pack into Chamberlain. This trail was a little more accessible to pack animals than the one from Maxson Trail Head. After loading the jeep trailer and weighing all the packs for the pack animals, off we headed to Chamberlain. **Fredi Chrisman and Gene Simone** caught a ride in the jeep while **Joe and Carol Kaminski**, **Jim Dixon, Pete Parkin, Pat and Duane Peverill** rode off down the trail. It took several trips to get all the supplies into the camp.

First day in camp everyone was busy setting up their living quarters for the next few nights. Yes, all the creature comforts of a tent. The next morning we had to meet **Bob Herrick** at the **Voyager Campground** to help pack in the boxes. Joe and Carol lead Bob in from Maxson Trail Head via the jeep road, while **Pete, Pat and Duane** rode off down the trail to Voyager Campground to rendezvous with the group. Gene, not having a horse spent time in camp helping and also walking the trails. **Gene** is quite the hiker. After spending most of the day getting the boxes into camp we called it a day. **Fredi** did the cooking along with the help of **Joe and Carol**. The food was out of this world. All the meals that were prepared where far above my expectations. This definitely was not backpacking food or as my husband would say MRE's. No one went hungry on this trip. Personal water was a little scarce and it all had to be filtered. The animals had plenty to eat and drink during their turn in the meadow in the morning and evening. All animals had to be high lined during the night.

After spending days installing the bear boxes, clearing some trails to make them safer and adding snow supports to the outhouse, it was time to think about packing up, heading out and back to the heat of the valley. I was kind of sad to see it come to an end, but was looking forward to a hot shower and the comfort of my bed. This was a very interesting experience and I am looking forward to returning to Chamberlain Camp next year. Thanks to everyone who made this trip possible and all the volunteers who did the work to establish and improve this beautiful camp.







If There Is A Need-Then There Is A Way

The Chamberlain Work Party was tasked with a mission of getting four Bear Boxes into Chamberlain Camp from the trail head a little over three miles away. It was either carry them on a wagon or get them in on mules. Our President Joe Kaminski presented the problem to Bob Herrick, an affiliate member and very experienced packer. Bob is a very creative person and always appreciates a challenge. After a month or so of trial and error and encountering problems he came up with the idea of using 4 X 4's approximately 12 feet long attached to two mules. He also had to create metal brackets to attach to the Saw Buck Pack Saddles to carry the 4 X 4's. Not just any mule could handle this situation, so Bob had to test it on several of his mules to see which ones would perform the best.

Bob used PVC pipe at first to ensure that no harm would come to his mules as he tested his creation. As with any project the safety of the animals and wranglers are at the fore front. The day finally came that we had to put it all together and pack the boxes into camp. Several outriders rode out of camp and met Bob and his pack mules at Voyager Camp Trail Head. The first box was loaded, and off down the trail we proceeded. Along the hour long trail we encountered several downed trees and some very tight turns between trees but all went well. During the four trips in and out we did have to do some minor adjustments to the load. We used a guide rider and two drag riders to watch the load and be available to assist. The pace going in was very slow. But as Bob says "Slower is Always Better".

Now there are four Bear Boxes to store food in at Chamberlain Camp. This is a great camp and this just makes it a bit safer. We cannot thank Bob enough for volunteering his time, expertise and animals to making this project successful! Happy Trails.

3 cups of Graham cracker crumbs
3/4 cup of butter or margarine melted
1/3 cup of sugar
3 cups of miniature marshmallows
2 (12ounces) of semi sweet choc chips

Combine crumbs butter and sugar; press half into a greased 9 by 13 pan. Sprinkle with marshmallows and chocolate chips. Top with remaining crumb mixture; press firmly. Bake @ 375° for ten minutes. Remove from oven and immediately press top firmly with spatula. Cool completely. Cut into bars. Yield 3dozen



Objectives & Purpose of the Backcountry Horseman of California From the BCHC Bylaws

- To improve and promote the use, care and development of California backcountry trails, campsites, streams and meadows; to advocate good trail manners.
- To promote the conservation and utilization of our backcountry resources in concert with livestock transportation.
- To keep the backcountry trails and forage areas open to horseman on all public lands.
- To keep current information before the Corporation membership and its local Units regarding new legislation or management plans related to government regulations of the backcountry.
- To support or oppose new proposals, plans and restrictions as related to the interest of horsemen and those persons interested in recreational stock use and enjoying the backcountry.
- To promote the interest of people who, due to health or physical factors, need transportation other than by foot on backcountry trails.
- To promote public awareness and interest in the historical aspect of horsemen and stock in the backcountry and to help educate backcountry users on the ways to use the trail and foraged in a manner that conserves the backcountry resources.
- To assist in keeping the public informed of the vital need for a clean backcountry.
- To promote a working relationship with and keep the work and interests of the Corporation before our local, state and federal officials.
- To assist in the formation and continuation of local Units to carry out these purposes.
