USFS Ranger Academy Training June 5-6, 2014 By Randy Witt

Recently on June 5th and 6th, a few of our members who participate in BCHC work parties attended the **USFS Ranger Academy Training**. The training was held at Tamarac Ridge to learn crosscut saw skills and associated safety practices. Eager San Joaquin Sierra unit members **included Randy Witt**, **Ted Fischer**, **Joe and Carol Kaminski**, **Peter Parkin**, **and Fredi Chrisman**. These members were awarded by the U.S. Forest Service a certification as Class "B" crosscut sawyers.

Class "B" crosscut certification gives authorization to lead workgroups of noncertified work party members in trail clearing, including cutting downed trees and removing them from trails. This certification included training in proper use of personal protection equipment, safely approaching logs, assessing dangers from above including loose "widow-makers" in trees close by, leaning dead trees or "hangers", conditions of nearby dead trees, or trees showing disease caused by boring bugs or fungus. Safety assessment included how to safely cut the tree without getting the saw caught in the tree at its "bind" point.

In simple terms locating where a cut may be safely, effectively made, includes assessing where the downed tree is resting, causing compression of its fibers, or tension (stretching) of its fibers, or torquing (twisting) of its fibers, or likely a combination of all these factors.

Participants learned how to use a variety of different wedges to keep the saw's "kerf" open so as not to "bind" the saw in the cut, and use different kinds of wedges to prevent the cut log from falling or twisting before the cut is complete.

We also learned how to make compound cuts to easily allow the cut section to be moved from the trail in one direction or the other, and to use a pivot log under the cut piece to change the direction it may be moved.

One must keep in mind that many of these log sections, even after being cut, often are much heavier than one person or even many people can lift and therefore must be rolled or levered to a location away from the trail it may be blocking.

This training academy was very helpful to me and other participants. I now feel more confident that I could safely lead other backcountry work party colleagues in clearing fallen timber from trails.

Jerry Tindell Horse Safety Clinic for BCHC June 15-17, 2014 By Carolyn Witt

At the Rendezvous this year, **Ted Fischer** found out that **Jerry Tindell**, a member of BCHC and horse clinician, was offering to the California units a basic horsemanship, backcountry safety clinic. The state organization felt this was an excellent class to offer the units and was willing to help defray the cost. There have been many horse accidents in recent years and Jerry felt this was a way to help riders be more careful in the backcountry and on trail rides.

Ted brought this back to the Board and it was unanimously voted on to take advantage of the offer. We put it out to our membership and a group of us went up to the clinic to learn how to be safe.

A rider needs to know the 6 ways of moving a horse to be safe: stopping, backing, moving hindquarters left and right and moving the forehand left and right. The better you can do this the safer you are. I learned that you need to be able to ask once and the horse should do it immediately. If you have to ask and nag and pick at the horse to do it and then finally they agree, it is **you** not having control but **them** having it. You need to be a rider not a passenger on your horse.


The first thing Jerry taught us was the **one hand stop**, probably the most important thing to know when you're in trouble on a runaway horse. We practiced that until all of us were comfortable with doing it. We learned how to control our stock, horse or mule, while moving them around us in a short circle (12 foot diameter). This will get the horse to move away from us and then we can control the hind quarters as the horse crosses over his hind legs. This is called **disengaging the hind quarters**. The horse loses its momentum when we do this. We need to make sure the horse stays out of our space to prevent accidents.

We also learned how to open gates, how to bring your horse to a rock or stump when you don't have a mounting block, how to go up and down a hill safely and slowly, and high line. We talked about conformation and good hoof care. Jerry even put shoes on one of the horses that was limping, and the



next day the horse was out practicing with us again. We all had questions and Jerry answered all of them. It was a great learning experience for all of us whether we were new or seasoned riders. I think we all learned something and refreshed our skills on how to be safe.

The riders who went with their mounts were Joe and Carol Kaminski, Randy and Carolyn Witt, Debbie McFarran, Jerry Tindell, Duane and Pat Peverill, Pete Parkin, and Ted Fischer, .

To Pack or Not to Pack

To pack or not to pack, that is the question. If you have ever asked yourself is this what I want to do, then I have a place for you to go. Chamberlain is a horse camp that has been setup by the BCHC San Joaquin Sierra Unit. This camp is located 3 miles in from the Maxson Trailhead at Courtright Lake, California. Maxson Trailhead is good 3 hour drive from Fresno, California and offers ample parking for 10 rigs. There are restroom facilities at the trail head and also hitching posts. It is a fairly easy 3 mile trail leading into the camp and is ideal for the beginner. There are water crossings and several long causeways. The landscape surrounding the trail and the camp is just beautiful. The camp is on the boarder of the John Muir Wilderness and allows for day rides to surrounding lakes and into the wilderness.

The camp has a very nice bathroom that has a shower facility included. You can hang a solar shower bag inside and enjoy a warm shower in the privacy of the restroom. We even installed a shower curtain. The camp has 3 hitching posts and 6 tie rings so there is no reason to tie your animal to a tree which is a NO NO. You can tie your animal while putting up high lines if you are planning on spending the night. There is a large picnic table and fire pit to use when fire restrictions are not in force. The meadow has T Posts that go around the meadow and across so you can install your own battery powered electric fence to allow your equines turnout time.

As a newbie I had a great time joining the work party to finish up the camp. We ate like Kings and Queens as our cooks **Joe, Carol, Muriel and Fredi** went above and beyond to keep us fed. We spent most of the day working and enjoyed our evenings sitting around the camp fire sharing many stories from the past. This was a great time and all the participants worked very well together to accomplish the task. There were ten of us that participated in this work party. Besides the cooks mentioned above we had:**Steve, Jim, Randy, Pete, Duane and Ed.** Make sure you make a trip to Chamberlain. It is well worth your time. If you have questions, please ask. 


Tamarack 2014
