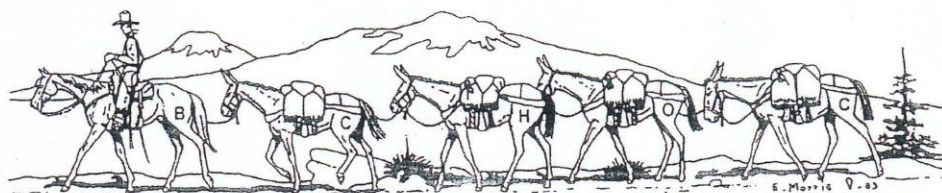

Caring can take many forms; a love of beauty, an enjoyment of wild plants and animals, an interest about the natural world, a feeling of oneness with nature, a desire for fun and leisure, the excitement of discovery, or even a need to be challenged. Know Before You Go

Be Prepared! Don't forget clothes to protect you from **COLD, HEAT, or RAIN**. Use **MAPS** to show you where you'll be riding and so you don't get lost. **LEARN** about the areas you will ride. Read books, pamphlets, etc. and talk to other trail riders who have ridden there. The more you know, the more **FUN** you'll have.

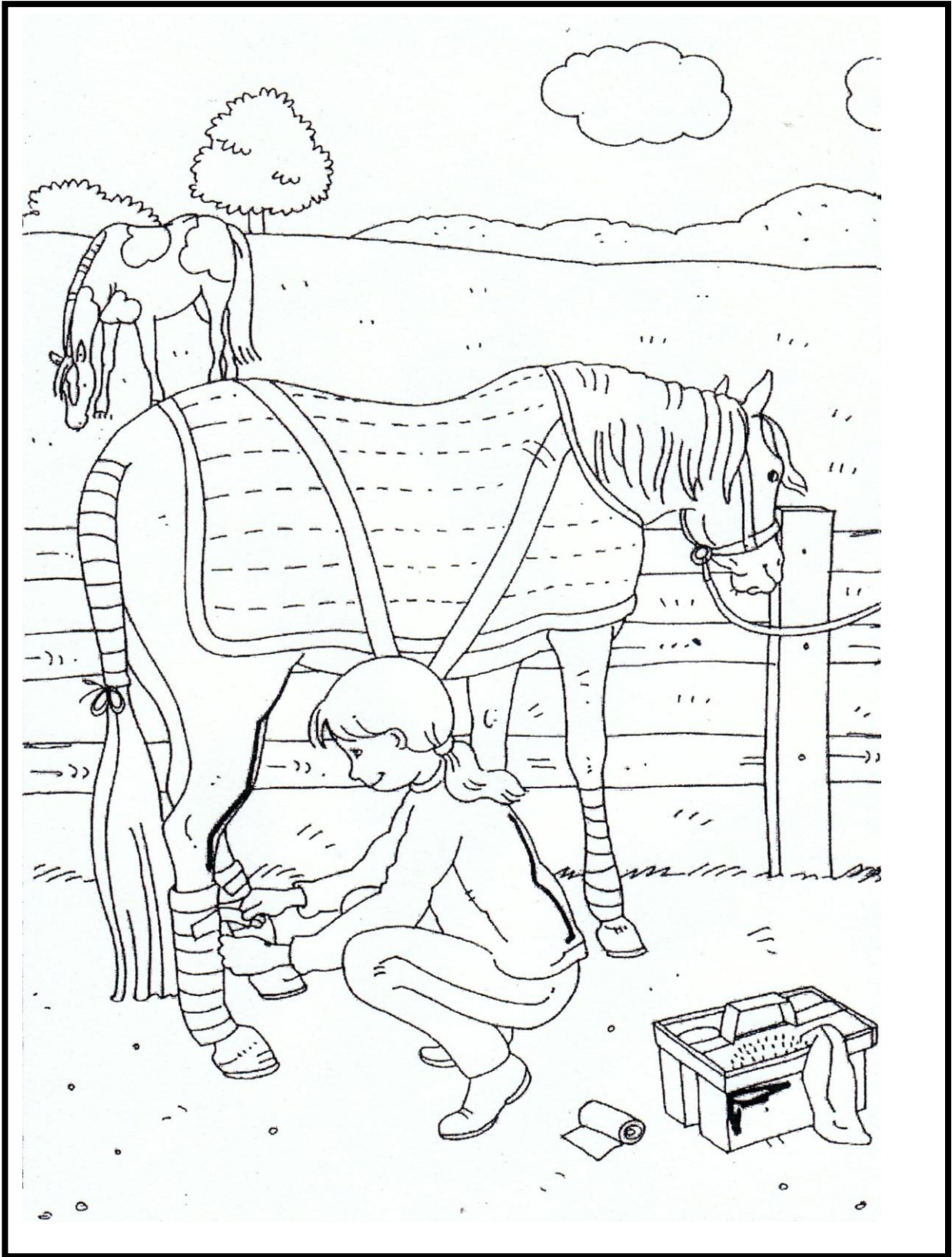

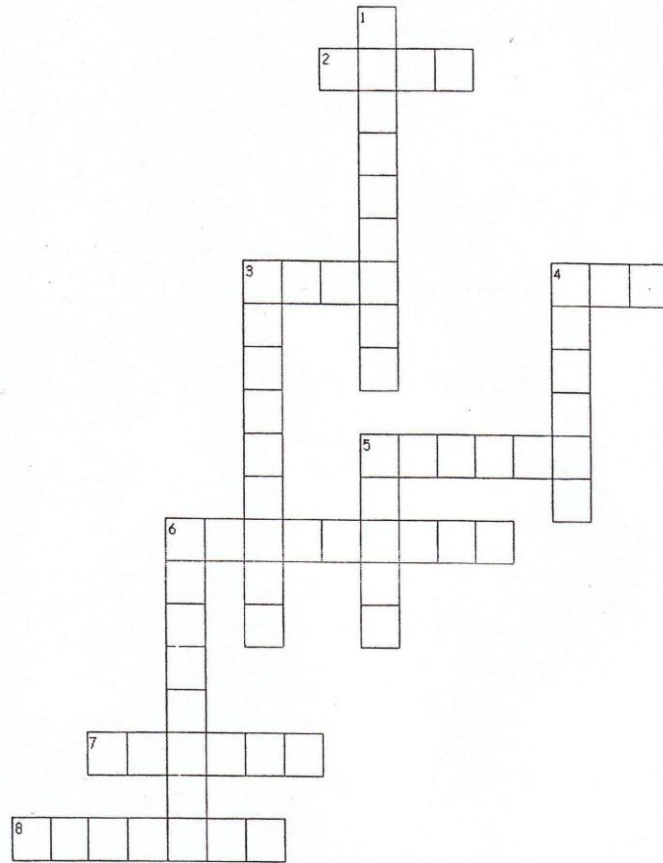

Back Country Cross Word Puzzle

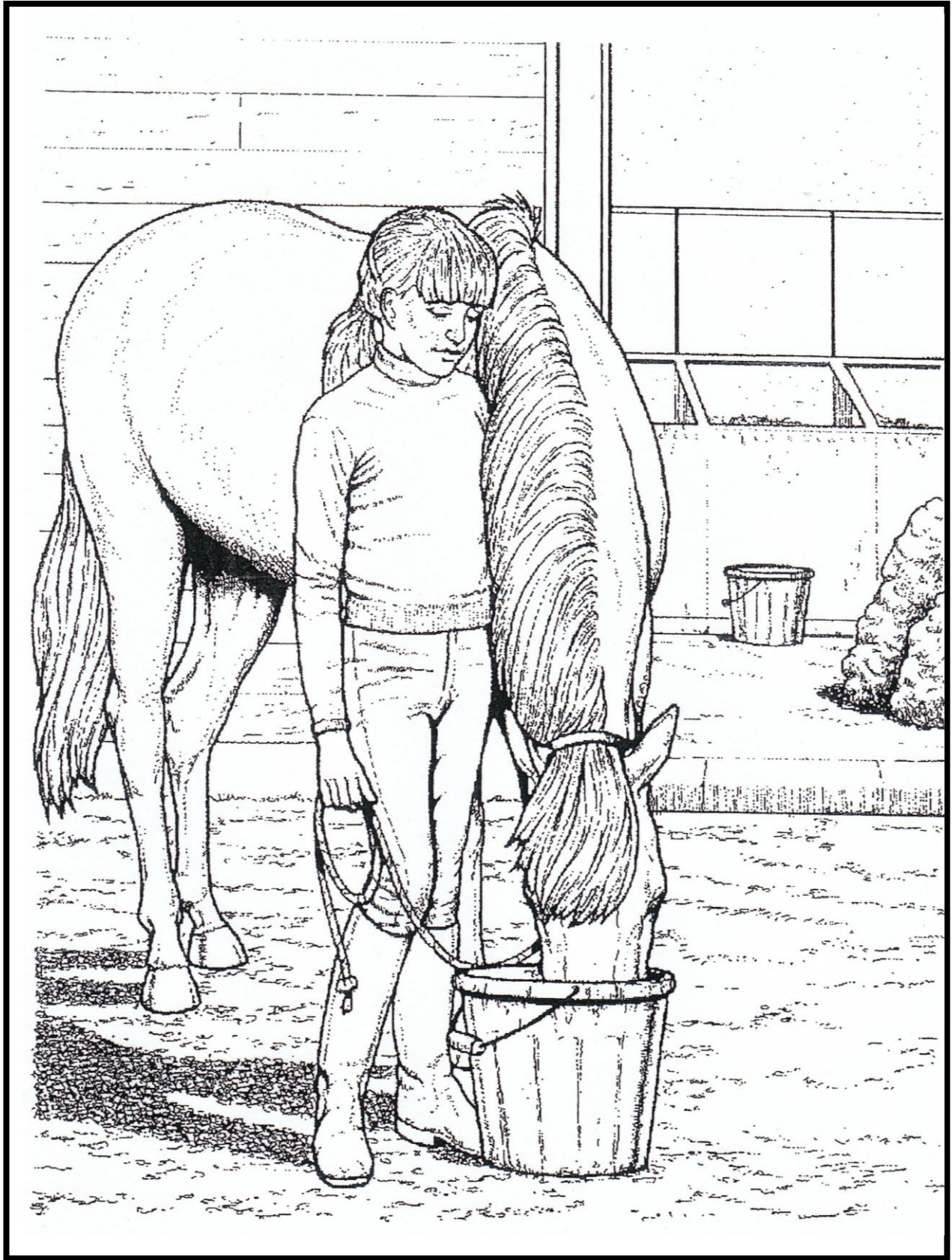


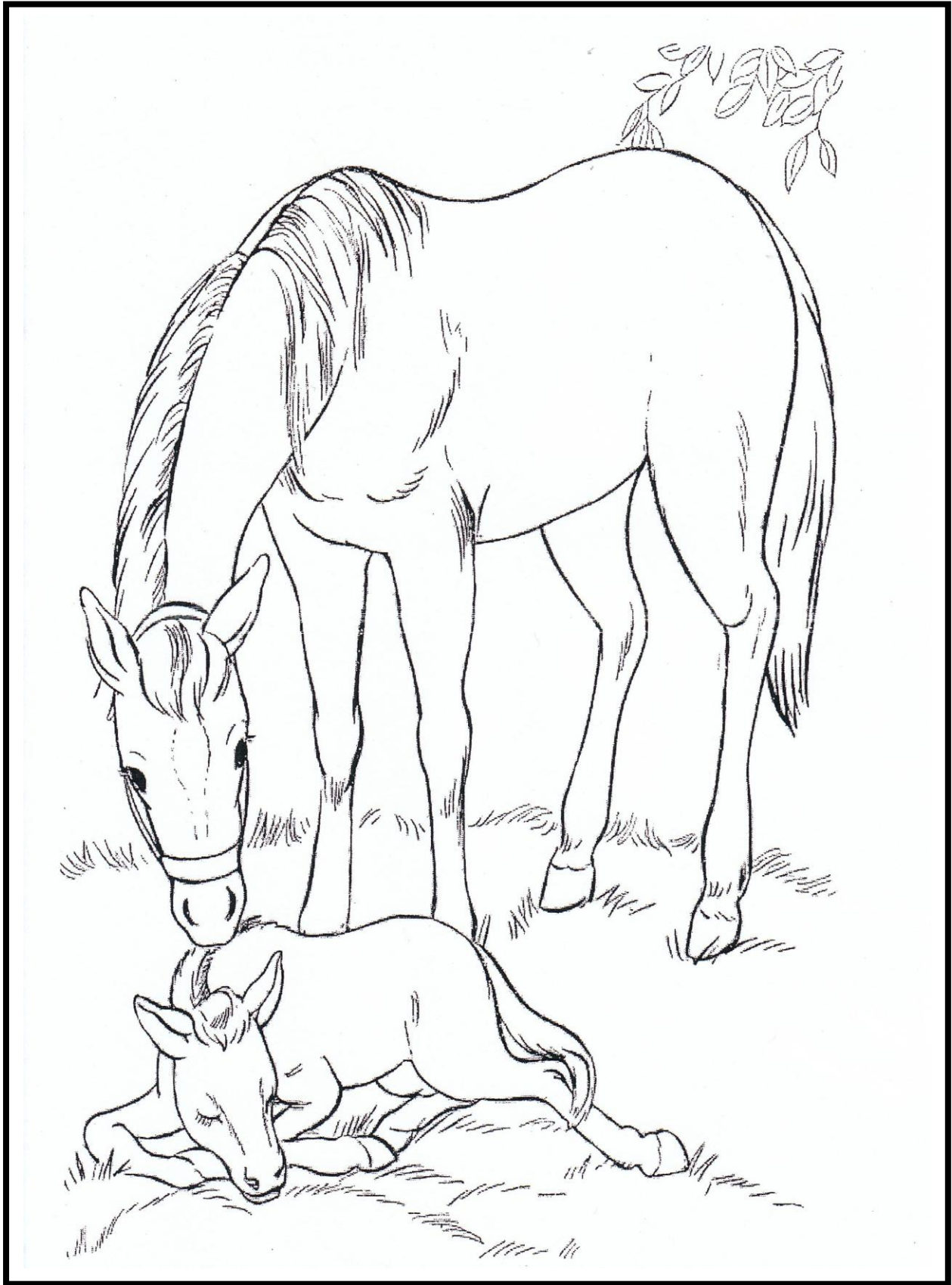

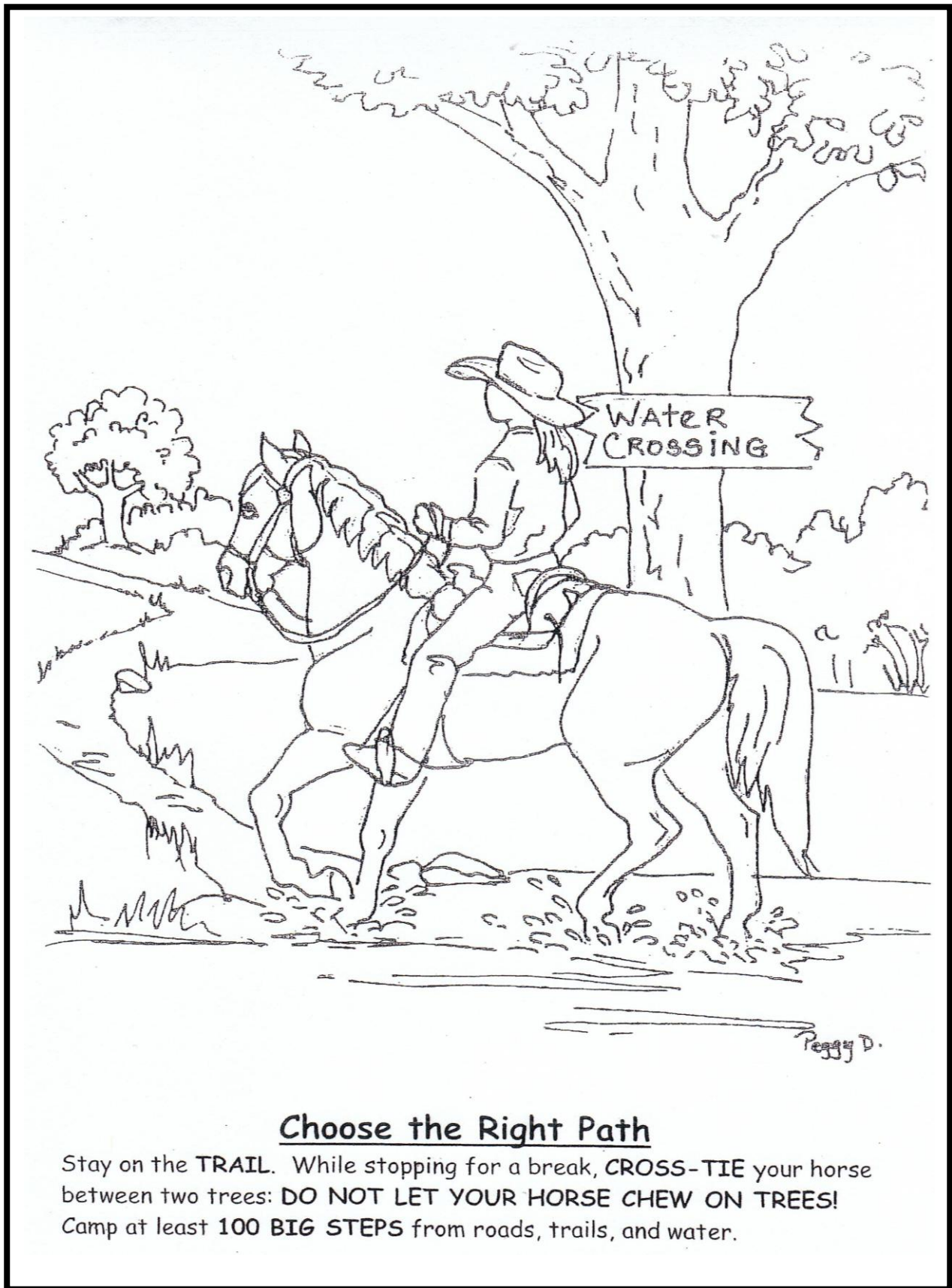
2. a small horse

6. an instrument used to clean the hard part of a horses foot

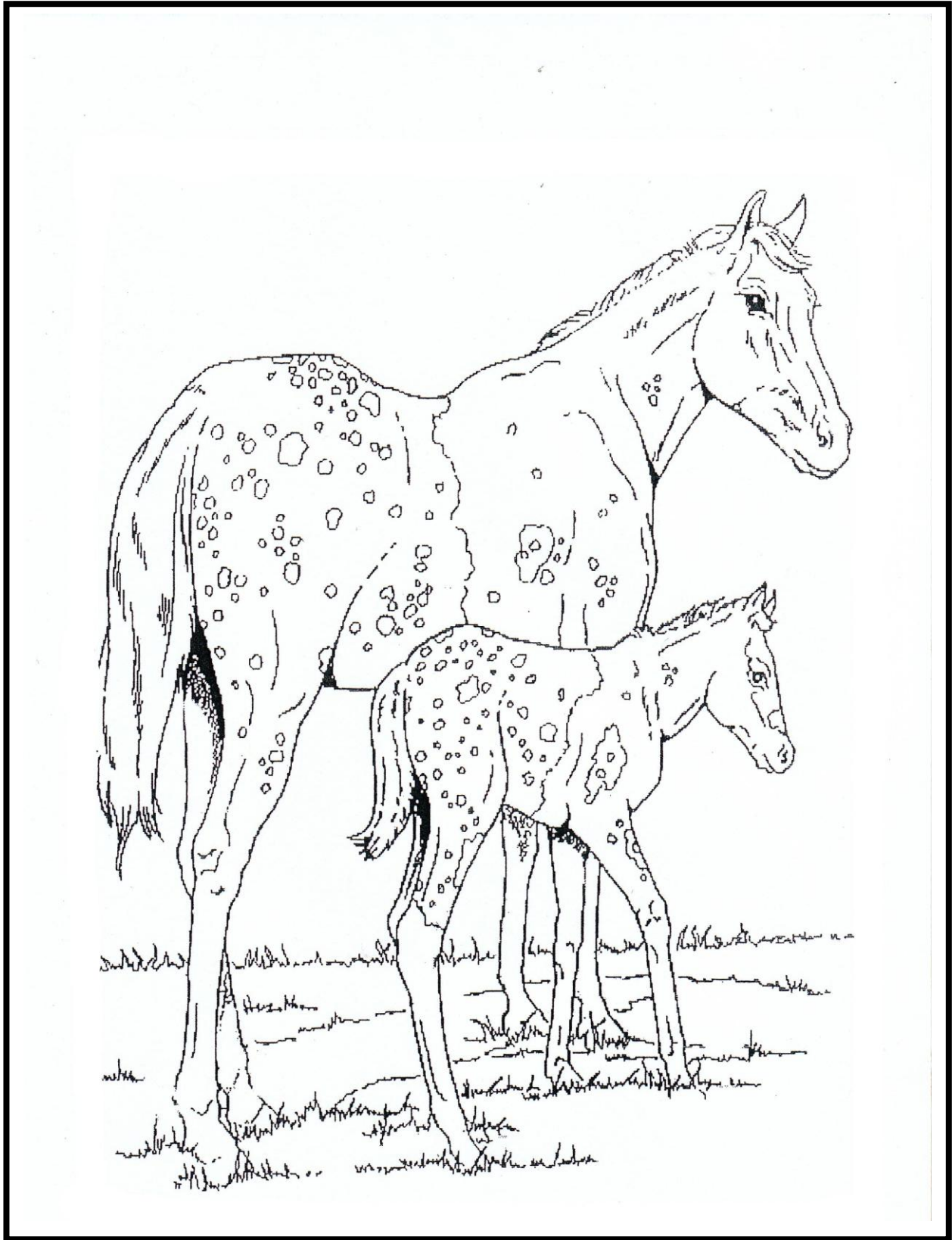




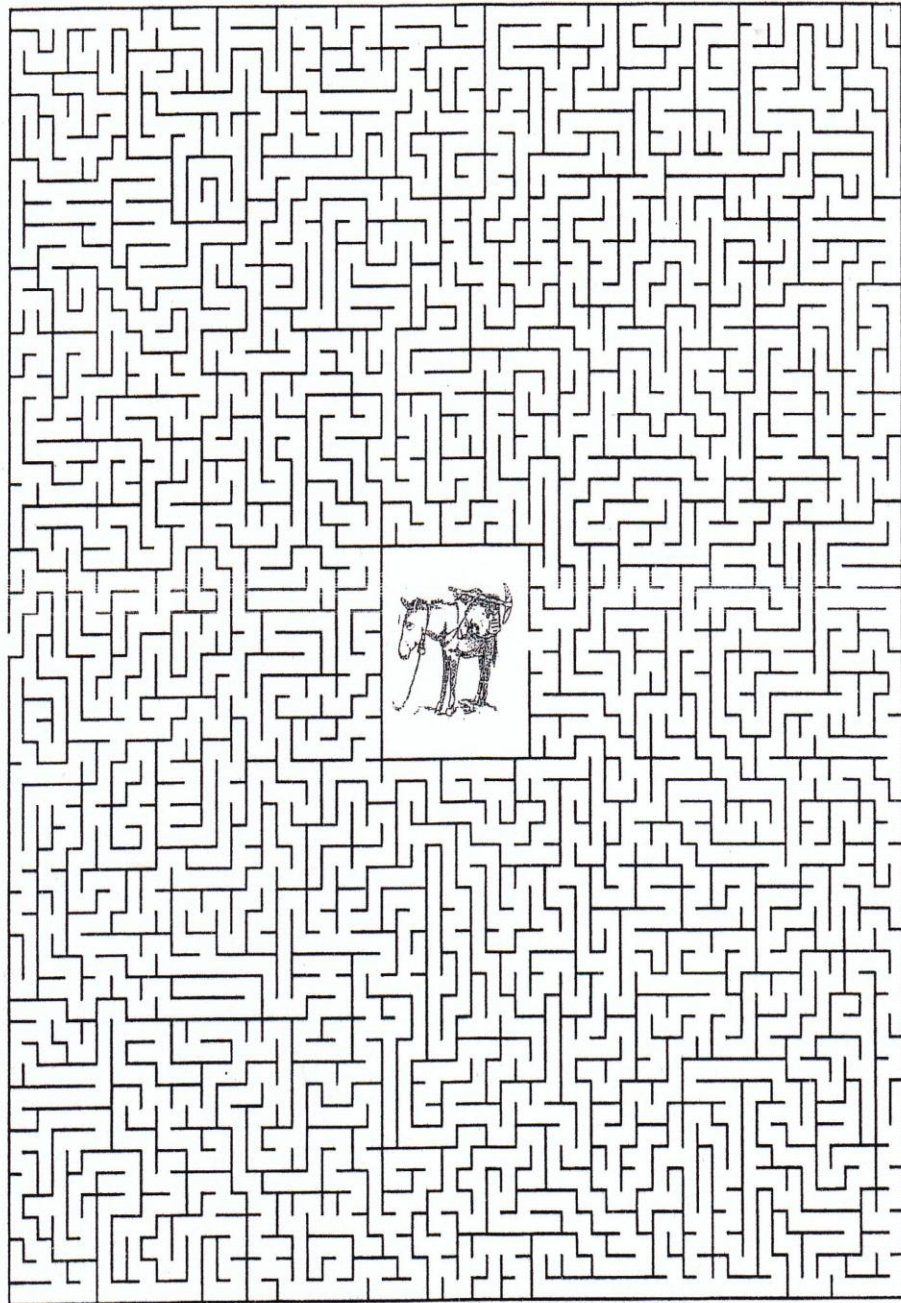


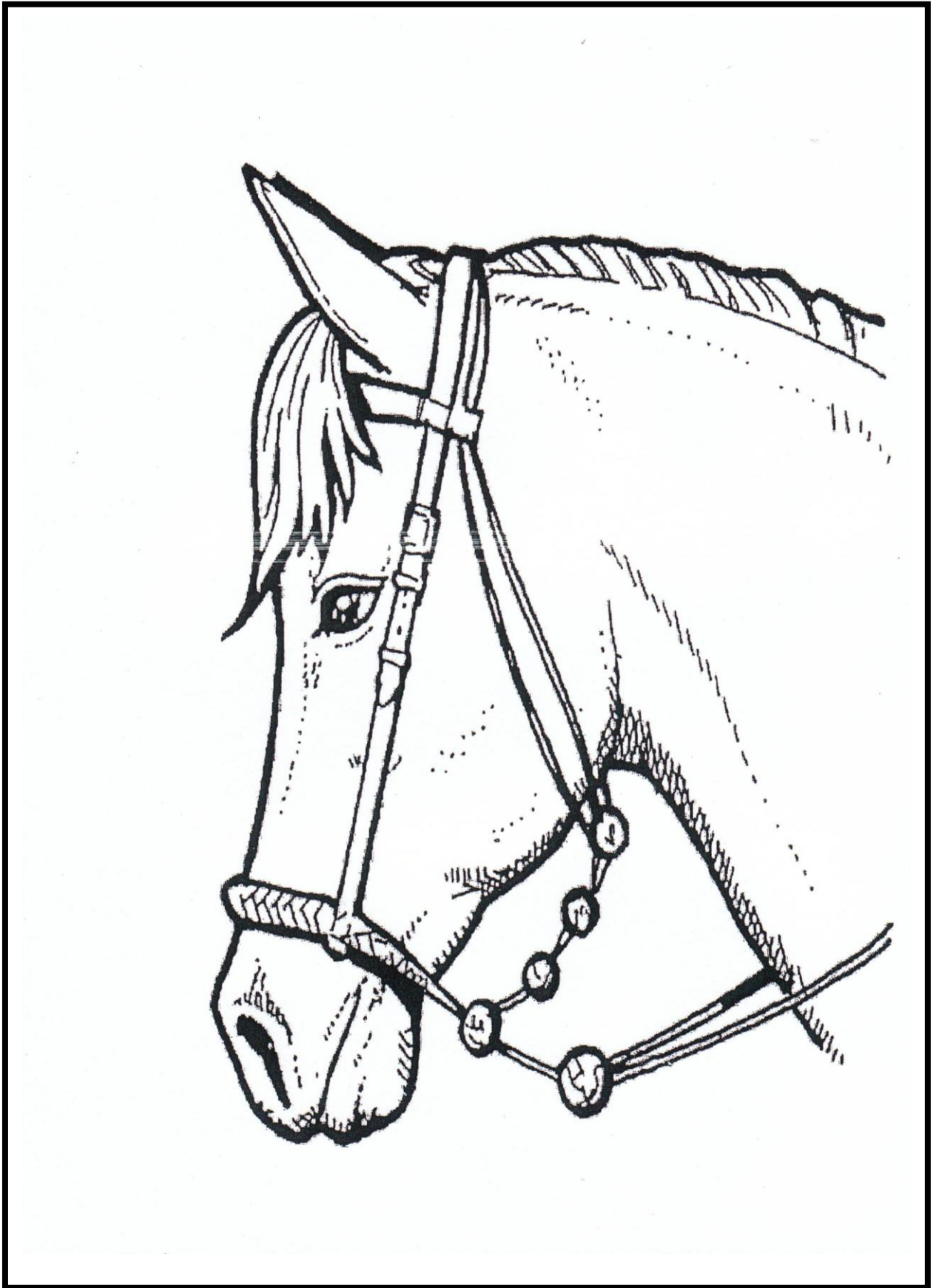
Choose the Right Path

Cowboy Finds His Horse

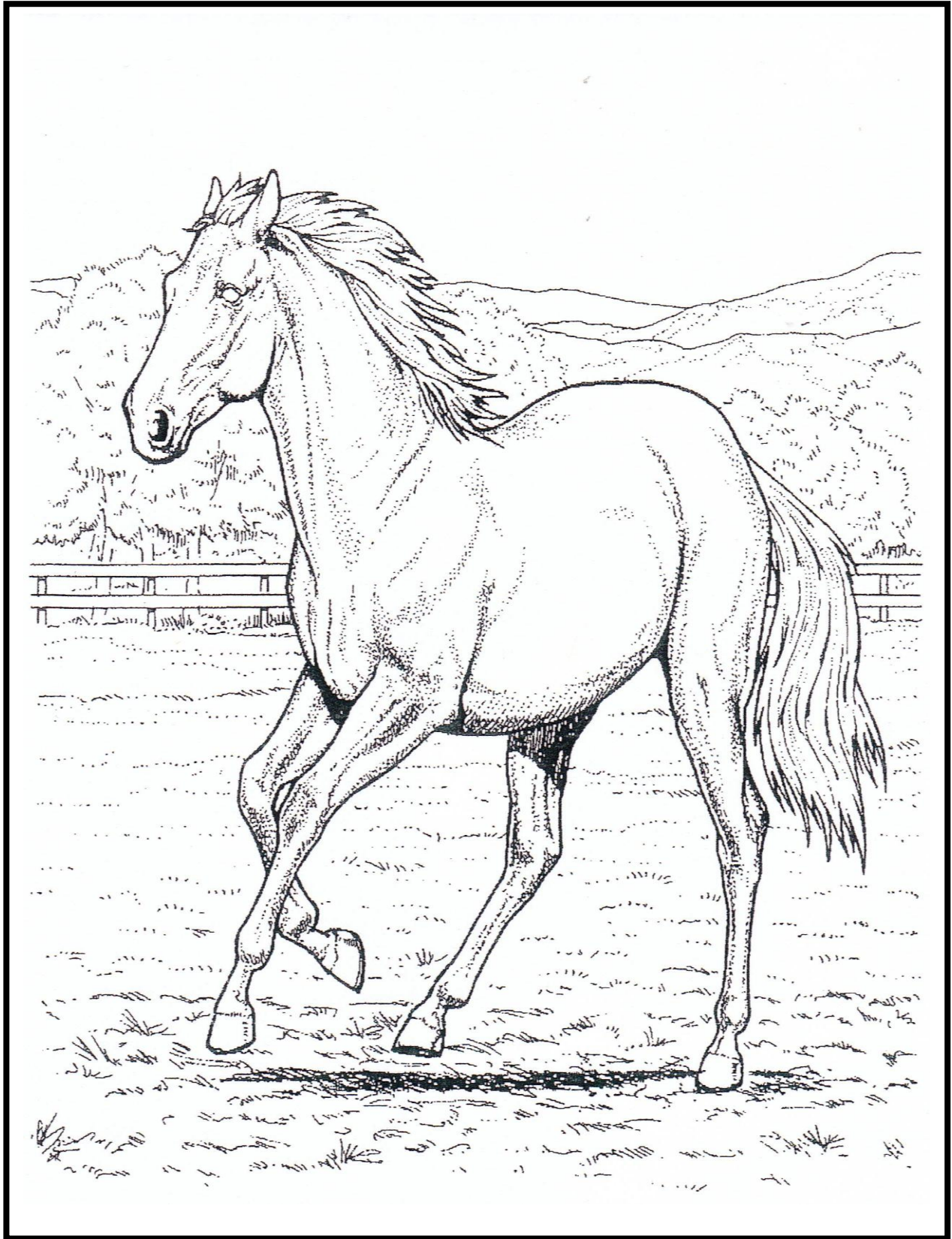






Trash Your Trash

Pack it in, Pack it out. Put litter, even crumbs, in trash can or carry it home. Use bathrooms or outhouses when available. If you have to "go" **ACT LIKE A CAT** and **BURY POOP** in a small hole 4-8 inches deep and 100 big steps from water. Place your toilet paper in a plastic bag and put in trash at home. **KEEP WATER CLEAN.** Do not put soap, food or poop in lakes and streams.

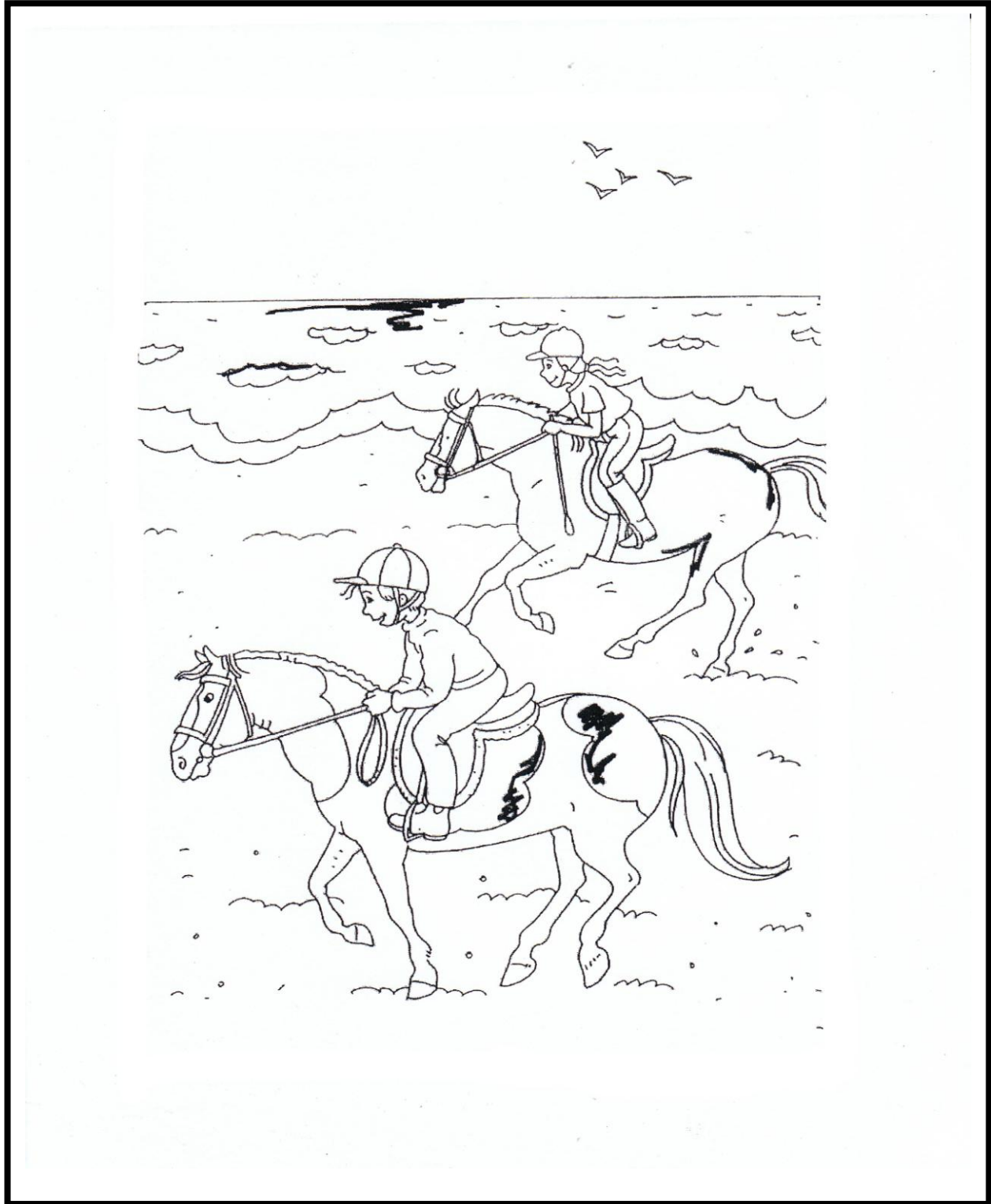


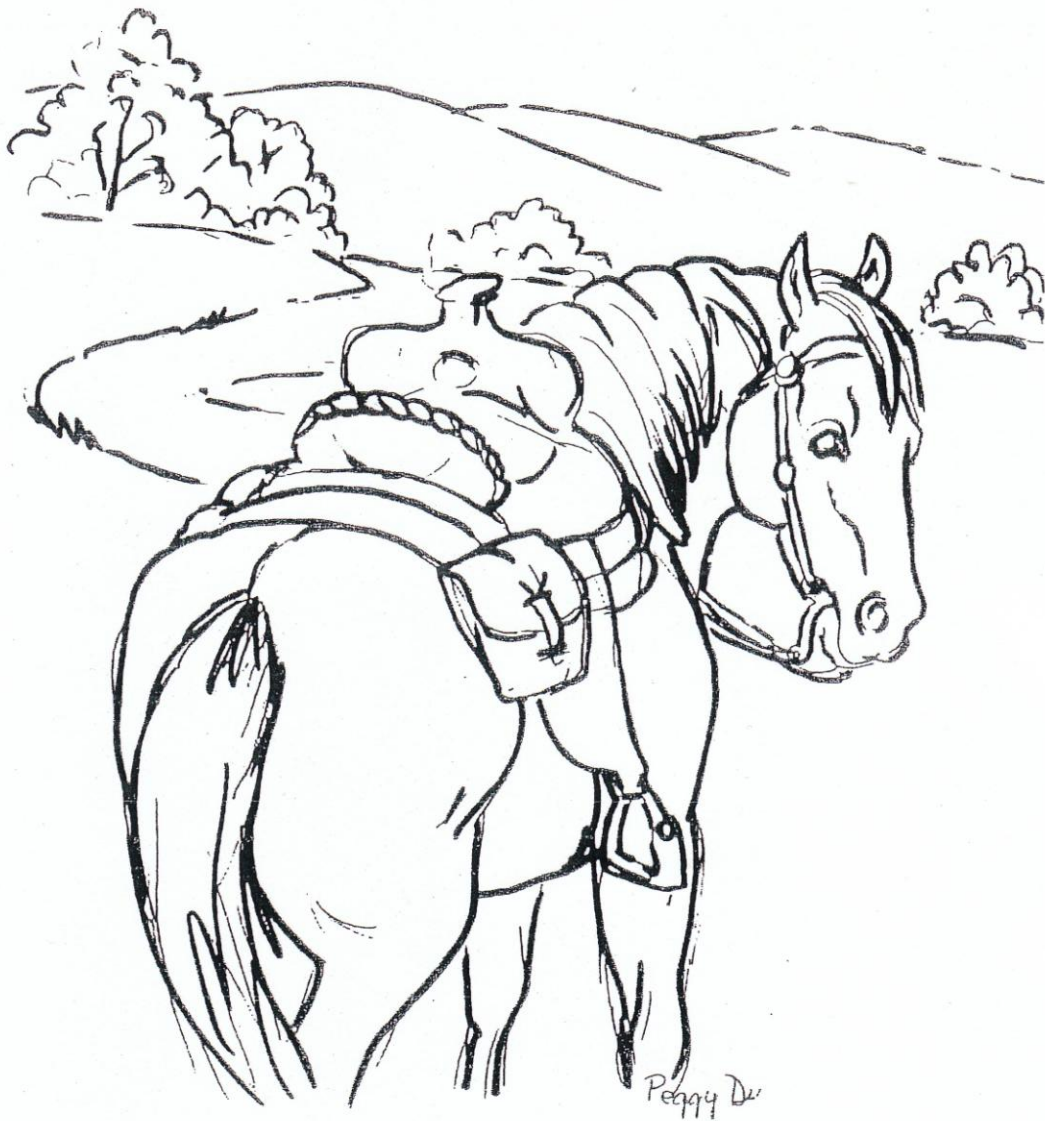

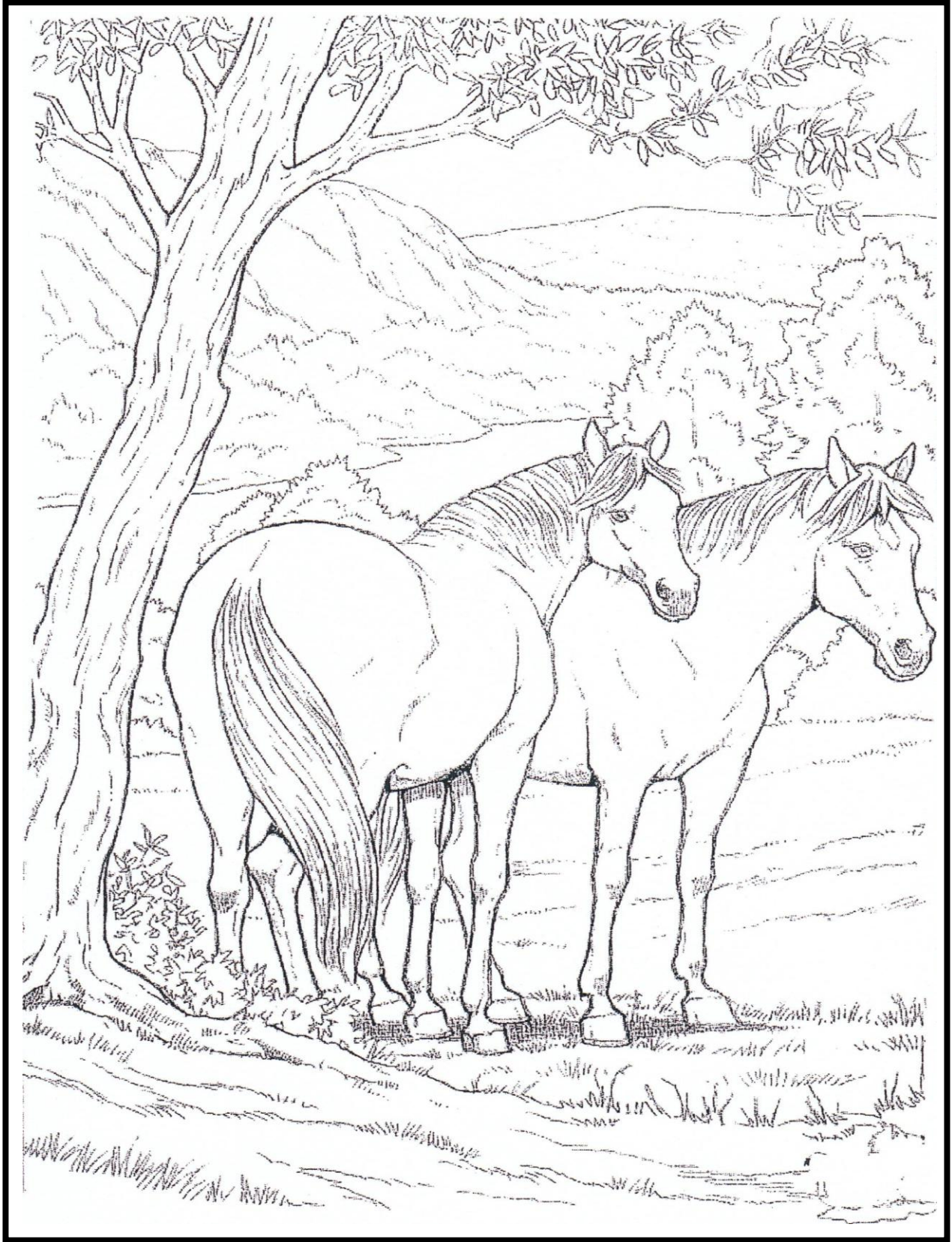


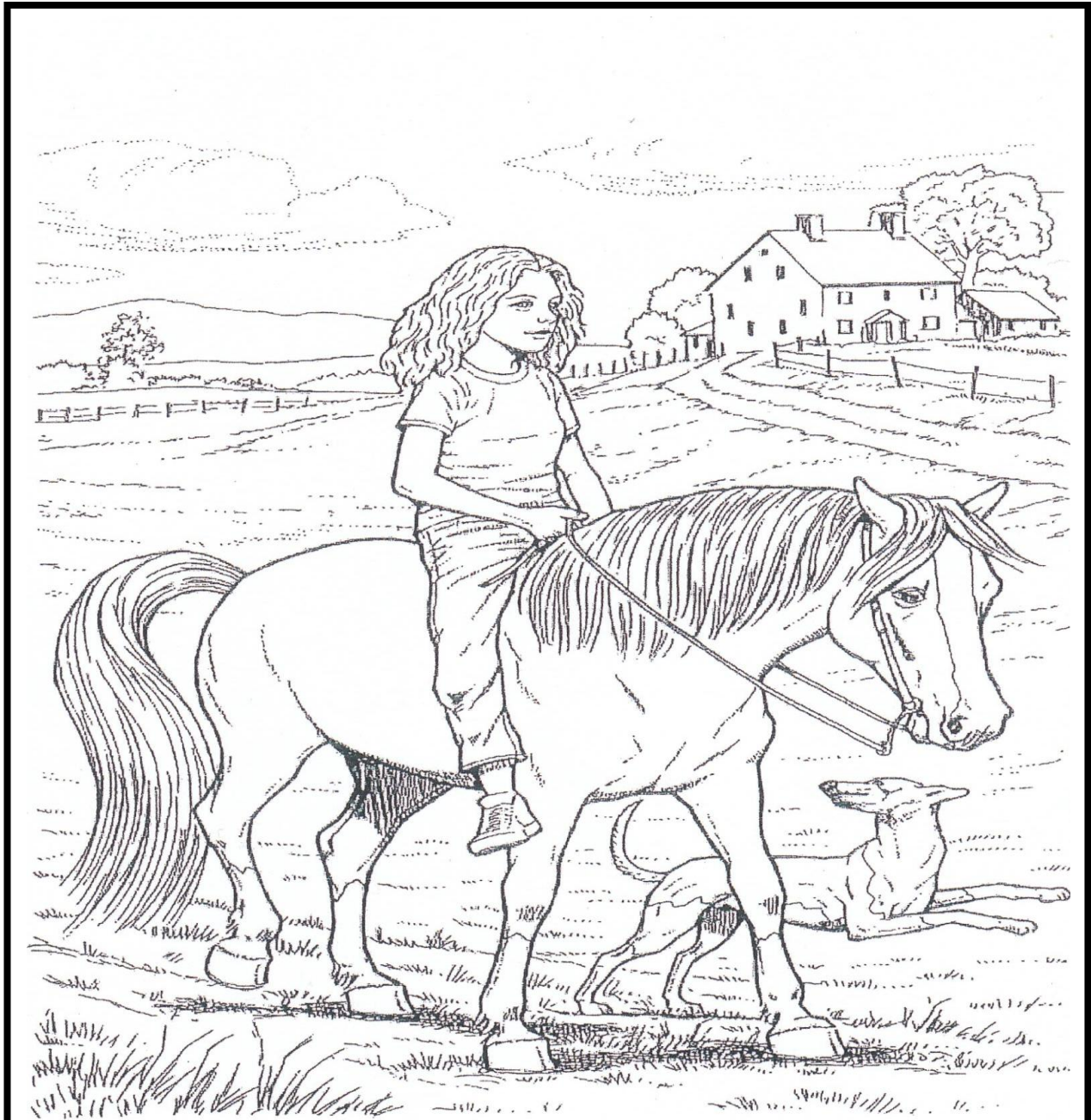


Respect Wildlife

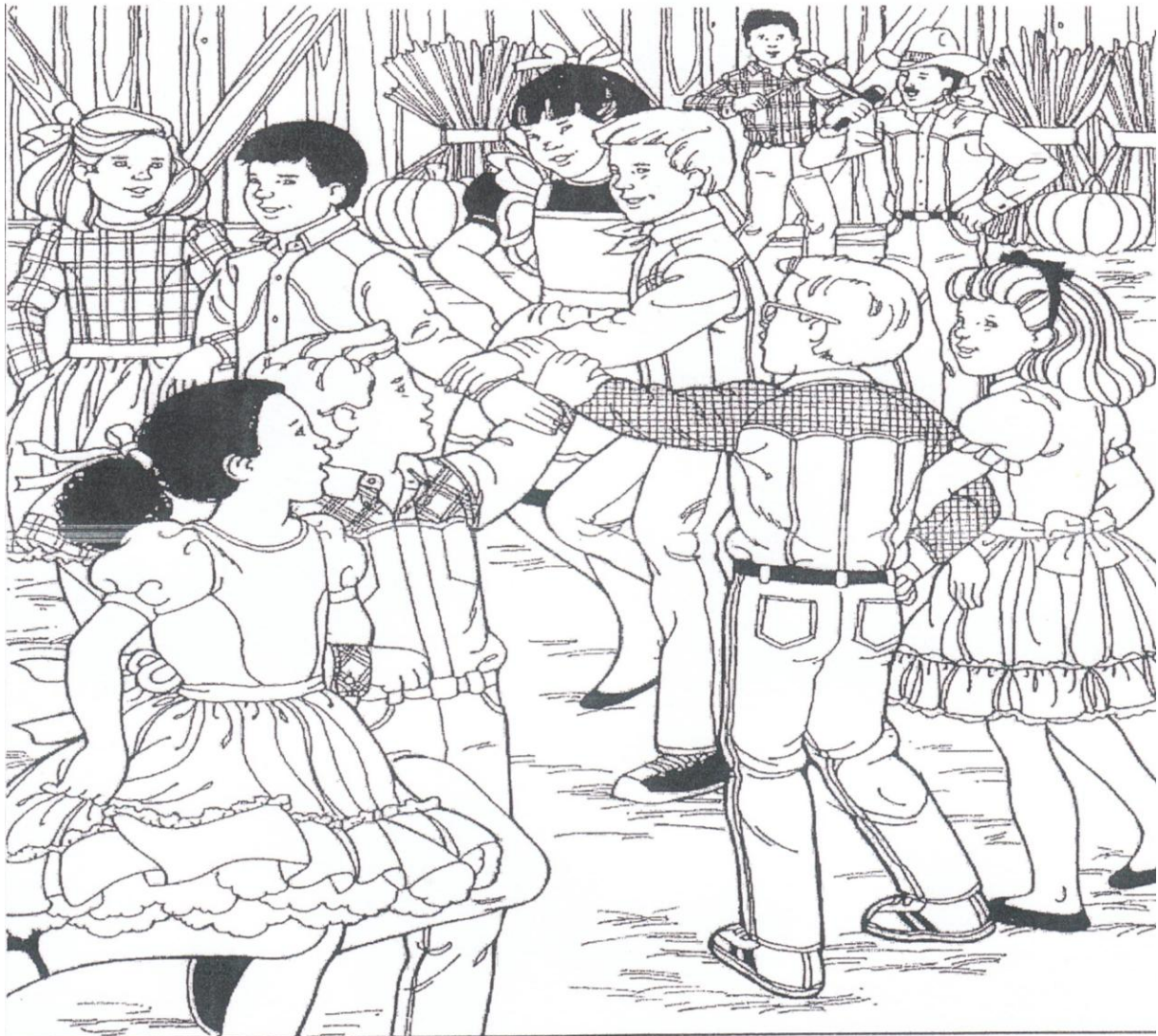




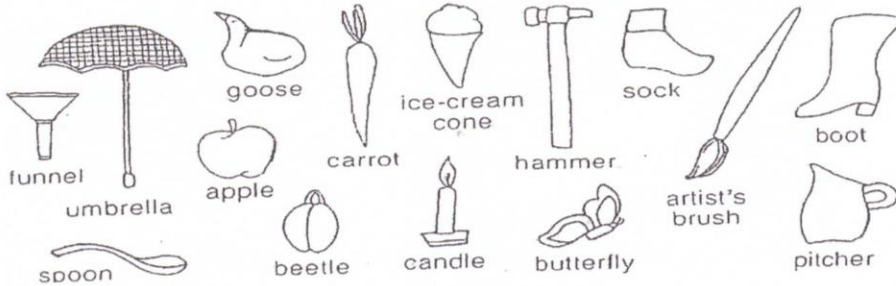
Be Kind to Other Users

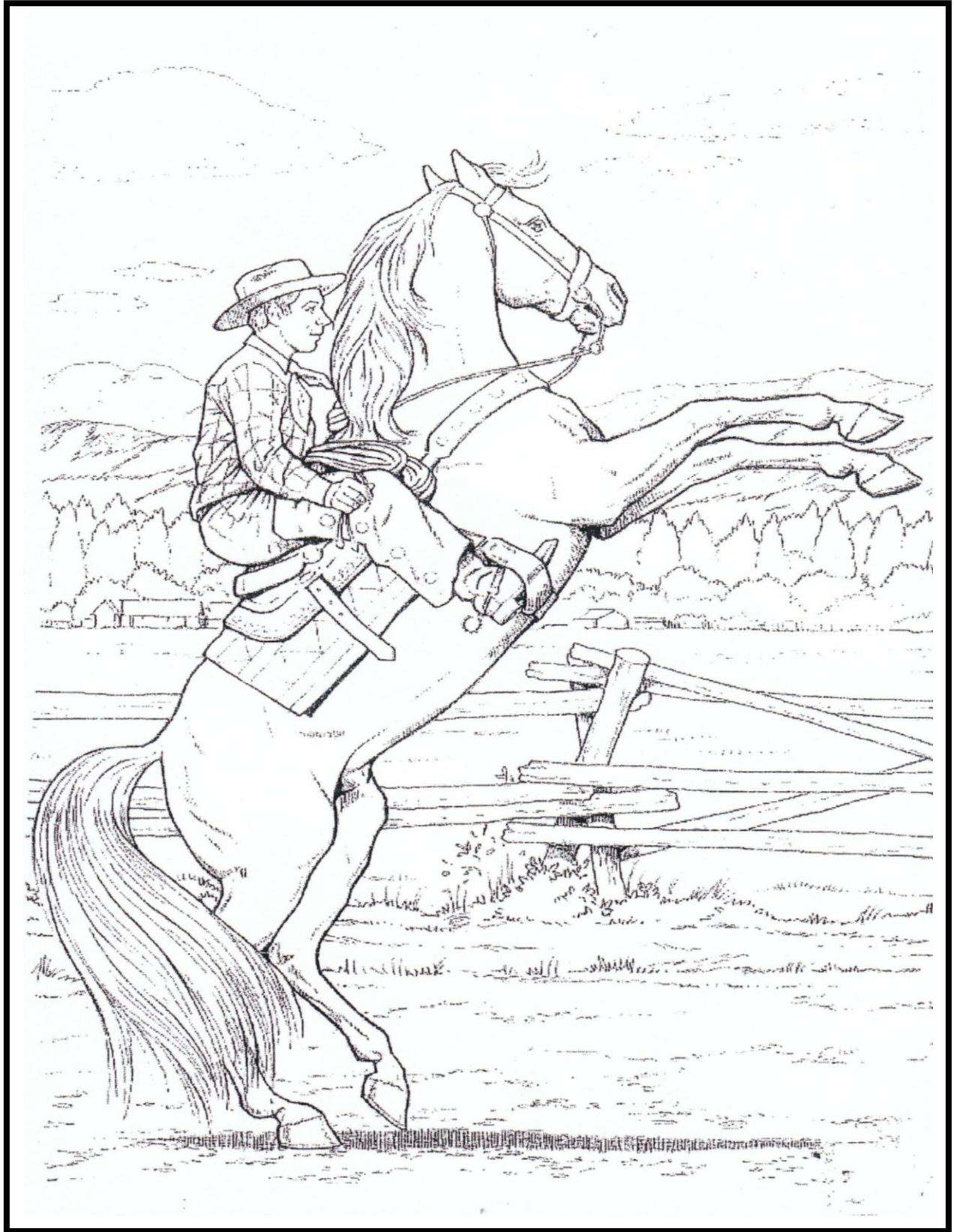
