



# Back Country Cross Word Puzzle





#### Across


- 2. a small horse

- 6. an instument used to clean the hard part of a horses foot










### Choose the Right Path








#### Trash Your Trash



Do not put soap, food or poop in lakes and streams.











#### Be Careful with Fire












# **Be Kind to Other Users**


