Several members from our San Joaquin Sierra Back Country Horseman Unit have been volunteering at the San Joaquin River Gorge. Members have been out doing everything from cutting downed trees from the trail to picking up trash. I have been one of those out on the trails picking up the trash. Cara Peterson and I walked down the fishing access trail to check out areas for future clean up. Several cans and other trash are in among the large boulders. The river was low enough to cross, so we walked downstream on the north side of the river, crossed again at Millerton Lake, then walked back up river on the River Trail. The northern trail was trash free, while the River Trail had a lot of trash near the caves. Our plan is to go back with trash bags and do clean up in that area.

On March 6th I walked the Ridge Trail, this time I brought along a bag to pick up trash along my route. I am pleased to report that the only trash along the trail was near the bridge. The trails on the east side of the loop are in fantastic condition. I passed a couple of trail crews out working. The west end of the trail looks like work is needed on the steep section just below the ridgeline.



Plan to bring water for your animals. Since there has been very little rainfall this season we don't know how much water will be available at the creek.




Directions:

Hwy 168 to Auberry Turn Off. Go thru Auberry-take the right Y at the grammar school to top of grade. Take first left turn (follow Mono Wind signs), go past Mono Wind and continue on old railroad grade road (approx 9 miles). Stay right at intersections or Y's. At T intersection, after crossing bridge, turn right and continue on with a right turn which goes around where you can see the corrals where we will be parked. Small signs with BCHC will be placed on the roads where you should turn. It is a long drive into the T intersection so don't give up. See you there.

The camp is available to our Unit members for day use and/or camping with your stock. The camp is set up with three large stock pens and three camp sites offered on a 1st come 1st served basis. The three picnic tables and fire pit are located in a shared area. It is necessary for you to furnish water for personal use and stock use. **The pens must be cleaned of hay/manure after each use or a fee will be assessed for clean up**; remember our "Leave No Trace" policy. There is no potable water on site; however a porta-potty is on site for our human needs.
